BACKGROUND/HISTORY:

As part of the FY2025-26 budget process, the transfer for the debt service for the General Fund and the Water & Sewer Fund were approved within the operating budget, but the transfer from each of those respective funds to the corresponding CIP Funds and the actual debt payments were not. This action is to ensure the appropriation of the transfers and payment for debt service are properly annotated within the general ledger. Also, during the FY2025-26 budget development process the City of Martinsville had not received the final authorized street payment amount from the Commonwealth of Virginia. Since the final amount had not been received, the City of Martinsville budgeted for the same amount (\$4,442,000) that was utilized for FY2024-25 with the intent of bringing forth any additional amount for City Council to appropriate once the final amount was provided. The final amount approved was \$4,765,175.14. The intention is to appropriate the difference which is \$323,175.14.

In accordance with Section 33.2-319 of the Code of Virginia, the payment rates per lane mile for street payments have been approved by the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) for Fiscal Year 2026. In addition, Codes of Virginia 46.2-1140.1, 46.2-1143, 46.2-1148 and 46.2-1149 authorize the CTB to distribute overweight permit fee revenue based on lane mileage to localities eligible for maintenance payments. Payments will be made quarterly each year by the 30th of September, December, March and June by Electronic Data Interface (EDI).

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

First Presbyterian Church is requesting to rezone property located at 1901 Patrick Henry Avenue from R-N, Neighborhood Residential, to R-T, Residential Transitional. The purpose of the rezone is to allow for professional office space on the property by-right, while still maintaining the primary residential element of the area. Due to lower membership in recent years, the church is looking for options to subsidize its income. They currently have a lot of empty space available and are interested in renting out the empty spaces for professional offices. Any potential renters will be thoroughly vetted by the church and they will not allow any renters that are not appropriate for a church environment or for the elementary school across the street.

The City of Martinsville Planning Commission held a public hearing on June 18, 2025 to consider this request. The Planning Commission recommended approval of the request by a vote of 5-0 (1 absent).

POLICY EXPLANATION

The R-T, Residential Transitional District is intended to serve as a transition between less intensively developed residential zoning districts and more intensively developed areas of the city, including commercial zoning districts. The district recognizes that certain appropriately located residential and non-residential uses may be compatible. If properly designed, managed, and maintained, they can offer a creative opportunity to enhance older, substantially developed neighborhoods with a workable and attractive mix of uses.

Properties zoned for the R-T, Neighborhood Transitional District are primarily located at the edges of the uptown business district, and in areas where established residential neighborhoods interface with major streets and entrance corridors.

REQUEST for REZONE- Application of First Presbyterian Church, Applicant and Owner, requesting to rezone property located at 1901 Patrick Henry Avenue from R-N, Neighborhood Residential, to R-T, Residential Transitional. The rezoning of property is a request that requires review by the Martinsville Planning Commission and review and approval of Martinsville City Council.

BACKGROUND:

The applicant, First Presbyterian Church currently owns approximately 10,000 square feet of unused classroom space. They are interested in leasing out the space to tenants for the use of professional offices, healthcare, and personal care facilities to generate income.

The property is currently zoned R-N, Neighborhood Residential, which does not allow for professional offices, healthcare, or personal care facilities. The applicants are requesting to rezone the property to R-T, Residential Transitional, which is more flexible and will allow for the proposed uses. All tenants will be reviewed and approved by the church. No facilities involving drug or alcohol treatment or other uses inconsistent with church programs or a child day care will be considered.

RESIDENTIAL TRANSITIONAL (R-T) DISTRICT PURPOSE AND INTENT:

The R-T, Transitional Residential District (replacing the formerly P-1, P-2 or RP-1 Districts) is intended to serve as a transition between less intensively developed residential zoning districts and more intensively developed areas of the city, including commercial zoning districts. The district recognizes that certain appropriately located residential and non-residential uses may be compatible. If properly designed,

managed, and maintained, they can offer a creative opportunity to enhance older, substantially developed neighborhoods with a workable and attractive mix of uses.

Properties zoned for the R-T, Neighborhood Transitional District are primarily located at the edges of the uptown business district, and in areas where established residential neighborhoods interface with major streets and entrance corridors.

The R-T District allows certain residential uses in combination with non-residential uses including personal service uses, health care uses, and professional office uses that can complement established residential neighborhoods and serve neighborhood residents in a convenient and attractive way. Large scale retail uses are not permitted in the district, but neighborhood restaurants and coffee shops are encouraged. Individual projects are limited to a floor area ratio (FAR) equal to 0.25 with individual non-residential establishments limited to five thousand (5,000) square feet gross floor area.

The intent of the district is also to encourage attractive redevelopment and revitalization of the existing uses, allow for creative infill development, preserve existing natural features and vegetation, promote high quality site planning and architectural design, facilitate the efficient layout and orientation of utilities and community infrastructure.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Adjoining property owners were notified of this rezone request. As of the date of this report, staff has not received any comments or concerns from adjoining property owners.

Staff recommends approval of the rezoning request, finding that the request will promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the public and assist in the implementation of the City's adopted Comprehensive Plan for the orderly future development of the City.

NEXT STEPS:

Planning Commission will hold a public hearing to consider the Right of Way Abandonment request and make a recommendation to City Council. The Planning Commission will either recommend approval, denial, or to delay action. Once the Planning Commission makes a recommendation of approval or denial, a public hearing will be held before City Council for their final decision of approval or denial of the request.

(APPROVE) I make a motion to recommend *APPROVAL* of the rezoning request, finding that the request as presented on June 18, 2025 will promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the public and assist in the implementation of the City's adopted Comprehensive Plan for the orderly future development of the City.

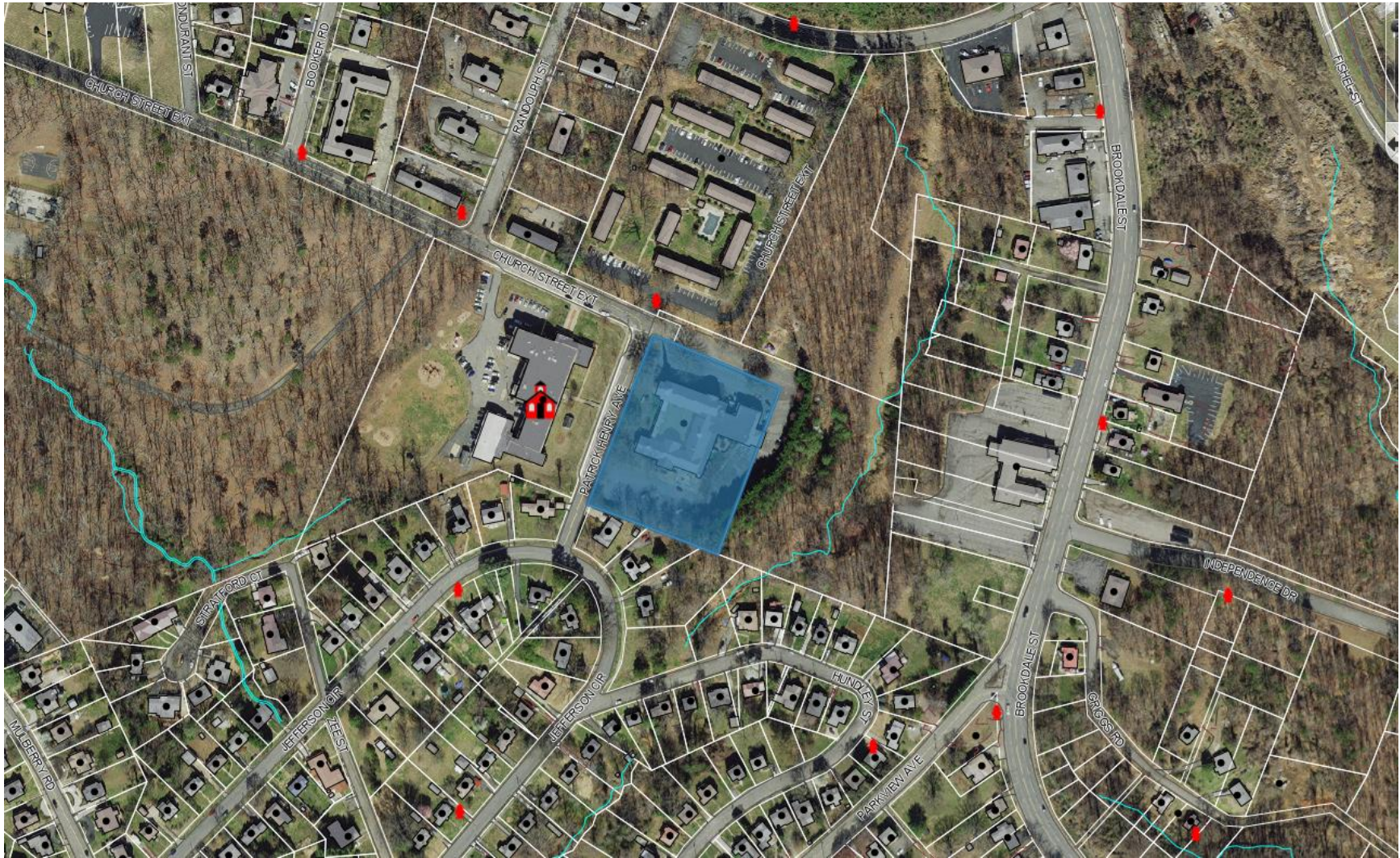

**ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING DISTRICT MAP
OF THE CITY OF MARTINSVILLE, VIRGINIA
TO REZONE PARCEL 45 (03)00 01A, 45 (03)00 01B, AND 350 (03) 00 C-5B
FROM THE "R-N, NEIGHBORHOOD RESIDENTIAL"
TO THE "R-T RESIDENTIAL TRANSITIONAL"**

WHEREAS, the First Presbyterian Church (the "Applicant") owns certain real property located, lying and being in the City of Martinsville, Virginia, described as being Tax Map Numbers 45 (03)00 01A, 45 (03)00 01B, and 350 (03) 00 C-5B, containing 10,000 square ft., more or less and as shown on that portion of the Zoning District Map of the City of Martinsville, Virginia (the "Zoning Map") (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has filed an application with the City, dated May 15, 2025, requesting that the Property be rezoned and reclassified from the from the R-N Neighborhood Residential District to the R-T Residential Transitional District, to allow for development or use underutilized office/classroom space, upon issuance of a conditional use permit (the "Request") as set forth and provided for in the Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, on July 22, 2025, the City Council for the City of Martinsville held a public hearing to receive public comments on the Request; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, after considering the Request of the Owner, the recommendation made by the Planning Commission, the City's Comprehensive Plan, the comments presented during the public hearings, the reports and recommendations of City staff, and the purposes and factors contained in Virginia Code §§ 15.2-2283 and 15.2-2284, has determined that the Request should be approved; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has also determined that the public necessity, convenience, general welfare and good zoning practice of the City require and support the rezoning requested and affected by this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Martinsville, that the Request to rezone and reclassify the Property from the "R-N Neighborhood Residential District" to the "R-T Residential Transitional District" is approved; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Zoning Map, adopted and made a part of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Martinsville, Virginia, Appendix B of the Martinsville City

Code (the "Zoning Ordinance"), is hereby amended to rezone and reclassify the Property from the "R-N Neighborhood Residential District" to the "R-T Residential Transitional District" and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the City's Zoning Administrator is directed to record and reference the foregoing amendment to the official Zoning Map of the City; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended as necessary to accommodate the foregoing amendment to the Zoning Map, and the area rezoned shall hereinafter be subject to the conditions herein imposed and otherwise subject to the uses, restrictions and conditions applicable to "R-T Residential Transitional District" contained in the Zoning Ordinance and to all other laws and ordinances applicable to real estate generally in such zones or districts; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that nothing contained herein affects, modifies, alters or repeals any restrictions, reservations, covenants or conditions imposed upon the Property by any deed, conveyance or other instrument in the chain of title thereto; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the purpose of this Ordinance is limited to the approval of the rezoning Request, and that nothing contained in this Ordinance shall be interpreted as the consent to or approval of any other matters or requirements relating to the Property; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Applicant shall pay to the City all fees, costs, and expenses required by local ordinance, rule or policy in the processing, advertisement, and consideration of the Request; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that failure of the Owner to pay all fees, costs, and expenses in accordance with the foregoing paragraph shall render this Ordinance null and void, and the Ordinance shall not be recorded; provided, however, that a notation on this Ordinance executed by the City Clerk that all such fees, costs, and expenses have been paid by the Owner shall conclusively establish that this Ordinance is effective and in all respects valid and binding; and

WHEREAS, Broadway 400, LLC, (the "Applicant"), record owner of the real property located at 1009 E. Church Street, has filed an application with the City of Martinsville, Virginia (the "City") requesting the City to vacate a portion of the right of way of Street, and to transfer title therein to the Applicant; and,

WHEREAS, the real property in subject to the Applicant's request consists of approximately 150 feet in width and running adjacent to 1009 E. Church Street, as more specifically described in the application filed by the Applicant, (the "Property"); and,

WHEREAS, the Applicant is the owner of real property bordering upon the Property and described as Tax Map Nos. 26 (06)00 /01; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Virginia Code § 15.2-2006 *et seq.*, the City is authorized to vacate or alter its public rights-of-way, subject to such conditions as determined by the City Council of the City of Martinsville, Virginia (the "City Council"); and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 15.2-2100 and 15.2-2008, the City is authorized to convey its streets or other public places, upon a three-fourths vote of City Council; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with Virginia Code § 15.2-2006, the City Council held a public hearing on the proposed vacation of the Property at its meeting held July 22, 2025, after notice as required by law; and,

WHEREAS, in addition to notice of the public hearing, the City also provided notice of the proposed vacation to the property owners adjacent to the Property; and,

WHEREAS, upon the above notices and public hearing, the City Council did not receive any objections to the proposed vacation, and referral of the matter to a Board of Viewers was not deemed necessary, as the Property in question has not been previously developed as a public street or actually used by the public as a public street; and,

WHEREAS, it appears to City Council that no public utilities would be affected by the proposed vacation, nor would any public inconvenience result by vacation of the Property and further that it would be advantageous to return the Property to the tax rolls by approving the vacation and transfer of the Property as requested by the Applicant; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Martinsville that the vacation and sale of the Property is hereby approved, subject to the following conditions:

1. That within ninety (90) days of the adoption of this Ordinance, the Applicant, at its sole expense, shall have a final survey prepared of the Property; and,
2. That within one hundred eighty (180) days of the adoption of this Ordinance, the Applicant shall pay the City an amount to be approved by the City Council at a public meeting; and,
3. That the Applicant shall provide the City with a copy of the final survey of the Property for purposes of preparing the deed of vacation; and,
4. That within twelve (12) months of the adoption of this Ordinance, the Applicant shall record this Ordinance, together with the deed of vacation and final plat, in the Martinsville City Circuit Court Clerk's Office; provided, however, that this Ordinance shall not be recorded until all conditions contained herein have been met; and,
5. That the Applicant shall be responsible for all costs associated with the preparation and recordation of this Ordinance, the final survey, and the deed of vacation; and,
6. That failure of the Applicant to satisfy any condition contained herein shall render this Ordinance, and any deed of vacation, null and void and of no force and effect; provided, however, that in the event that an appeal of this Ordinance is filed pursuant to Virginia Code § 15.2-2006, performance of the above conditions shall be stayed during the pendency of the appeal and all time periods contained in this Ordinance shall begin to run from the date that the City gives written notice to the Applicant that the appeal has been concluded.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Martinsville that the Acting City Manager is hereby authorized to take such actions and execute such documents on behalf of the City as are necessary to effectuate the purposes of this Ordinance, including, but not limited to, execution of one or more deeds of vacation, subject to review and approval by the City Attorney.

The Martinsville Arts & Cultural Committee is exploring the implementation of a community-focused public art initiative in partnership with Noblewins Products and inspired by the concepts presented in the attached Art Project Guide. BACKGROUND/HISTORY:

The West Piedmont Planning District Commission (WPPDC) is coordinating a regional application for Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funding through the FEMA 4831 Hurricane Helene disaster declaration. The proposed project would provide backup generators and associated equipment for critical facilities across multiple localities, including sites in Martinsville. To participate, the City of Martinsville is required to commit 5% in local matching funds toward the cost of acquiring and installing generators, transfer switches, and switch-gears at four identified locations. City Council approval is required in order to finalize the City's participation in the grant application and provide the required local match.

Total Project would be for:

1000 FISHEL ST

Total Cost of Project: \$1,201,080.

The City's 5% Contribution would be \$60,054.

This represents a **total cost savings of \$1,140, 576.**
